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## ABOUT SONGS FOR GATHERING

**W**E HAVE gathered ten of these twelve songs from the scripture song cassettes: “*Do You Not Know?*”, “*The Way Out*”, and “*Run The Good Race!*” Two songs: “*Oh, The Depth*” and “*Stand Firm*” were written after the recording of these tapes. (Both of these are on the Spanish CD, *in Spanish*.)

We have provided a variety of resources so that most groups will find the materials needed (whether overhead transparencies, bulletin inserts, or chorus sheets) to easily incorporate these songs in worship.

Our original purpose in writing these scripture songs was to enable us to better memorize God’s Word. Along the way we have discovered that putting the Bible to music can help express the meaning of a passage of scripture. We hope that these songs will provide an avenue for God’s Word and His Spirit to minister to your heart and the hearts of those with whom you fellowship.

We have used the New International Version of the Bible almost exclusively in order to maintain consistency from one song to another. (Scripture quotations taken from the HOLY BIBLE, NEW INTERNATIONAL VERSION, Copyright © 1973, 1978, 1984 by International Bible Society.) Although there are many great translations of the Bible, we have found that the NIV worked well for us in composing songs. We have enjoyed people’s surprise at reading a particular passage in their own Bible and discovering that

they had inadvertently memorized the verses by listening to one of these cassettes. There are three songs that do not follow the NIV exactly: In “*Stand Firm*” we have changed the word “because” to “for” and have left out the word “that”, believing (that) the meaning of the passage was still clear. “*Whom Have I?*” differs from the present edition of the NIV, chiefly because IBS changed the wording of Psalm 73:25 in its 1984 revision of the NIV. Finally, “*I Know The Plans*” comes from several different versions, having been inspired by a poster of Jeremiah 29:11 that quoted the Living Bible.

We are deeply thankful for the friends who have helped us with this project. Some have offered a few words of advice or a suggestion. Some have spent hours and hours looking for mistakes and inconsistencies. Some have provided expert advice on computers, music, and printing. Many have prayed for us. Many have given money to us for this ministry. It is in these two last categories that I couldn’t hope to list the hundreds of brothers and sisters who have contributed financially to this effort and have prayed for us.

Finally, we must acknowledge how much we have asked God to give us wisdom and strength as we worked on this project. He has been a kind, patient Father to us. We are thankful to You, Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith. We are deeply grateful for the gift that You have graciously poured out on Your Church— the Holy Spirit. May we keep in step with Him...

## MINISTRY INFORMATION

**T**HE THREE *Songs from the Bible* CDs use a contemporary translation of the Bible. To establish consistency from song to song, we have used the New International Version, as noted above, for almost every passage of scripture. The primary instrument for these tapes is the guitar with accompaniment including flute, violin, oboe, viola, cello, dulcimer, and harmonica.

- 2) *The Way Out* . . . . . (18 scripture songs)
- 3) *Run The Good Race!* . . . . . (19 scripture songs)

**Additional copies** of the CDs: We encourage you to request as many copies as you can use. You are also welcome to copy our CDs. In some cases when you need a copy of a CD right away or if you are requesting from outside of the United States, you may have to duplicate the disc yourself. Otherwise our copies will have the advantage of including all the song information on the CD itself, the scripture words and references on the insert card, and will be standard CD quality. We will do our best to provide these to you.

**Spanish CD:** We have a Spanish CD which includes eight of the scripture songs that have been translated into Spanish. The CD is called “**Firmes Seguid**,” which means, “Stand Firm.” We also have music available in Spanish. Please let us know if you are interested in having us send either or both of these items.

**Instrumental Music:** The Spanish CD includes instrumental versions of eight scripture songs. (16 tracks total.) Besides providing the advantage of purely instrumental music, it will allow people who are unable to accompany the songs on an instrument to be able to sing along with these scriptures. (in Bible studies, prayer meetings, fellowship gatherings, personal worship times, etc...) This, of course, could be helpful in both Spanish or English-speaking settings.

**Scripture Song Compilation:** We have a new format of CD: the data CD. This CD will not play on a standard CD player, but is intended for a computer, giving one the options of playing the songs on the computer or transferring them to an mp3 player. Most of the songs from all the standard CDs are on this data CD. There are about 65 song files. These songs are in mp3 format, meaning that they do not have the full fidelity/quality of the music CD versions, but they will sound remarkably close.

# CONTENTS

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SIX different resources are provided for each song. The book is divided into the six categories. Within each category the twelve scripture songs are arranged alphabetically. The six categories are:

- I. **Lead Sheets:** *melody line, words, and chords. (Useful for both lead and accompanying instrumentalists and for vocalists)*
- II. **Guitar Chords:** *words and chords. (Useful for guitar, piano, bass, and other accompanying instruments)*
- III. **Music Overheads:** *melody line and words. (Photocopied onto a transparency, these are useful for introducing a new song)*
- IV. **Overheads:** *words only. (Photocopied onto a transparency, these are appropriate when the melody is familiar)*
- V. **Bulletin Inserts:** *melody line and words. (Helpful for teaching a new song and for providing a take-home reference)*
- VI. **Chorus Sheet:** *words only. (Photocopied onto the front and back of a single sheet of paper and folded, this makes a handy reference for all twelve songs)*
